### Article 1

*Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.*  
*Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, in each State one Representative, or a small Number of Representatives, as the Legislature of each State may direct. No Representative shall have less than two Years of Service, and shall, when elected, be subject to the Electors of his State. The House of Representatives shall elect their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.*  
*Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Electors in each State for six Years, and each Senator shall have three Years of Service. They shall, when first assembled, in all the original States, choose one of their Number to be President of the Senate (who shall not be a Representative) and two to be Vice Presidents, who shall, if a Vice President die, or resign, or be expelled, or be disqualified by the Constitution, or be incapable of discharging the Duties of that Office, choose one of their Number to be Vice President. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of trying all Impeachments, when presented by the House of Representatives; and when sitting for that Purpose, they shall be on Oath or Affirmation. The President of the Senate shall be the Chief Justice of the United States, or in his Absence the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, or in his Absence and that of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, the President of the Senate chosen by the Senate. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of confirming and rejecting all Appointments, and all Grants of Letters of Marque and Reprisal, and all Grants of Pardons and Reprieves, and all Grants of Amnesties and Forfeitures, except those to be pardoned by the Law of the Land; and of fixing the Punishment in all Cases of Impeachment, except in Cases of Expulsion, which shall not affect the Incapacity of the Offender to hold any Office of Honor, Trust or Profit under the United States; and of proposing and passing Amendments to the Constitution, but no Amendment which may affect the equal Rights of Senators and Representatives, or the Electors in any State, shall be valid without the assent of three fourths of all the Members present.*  
*Section 4. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.*  
*Section 5. 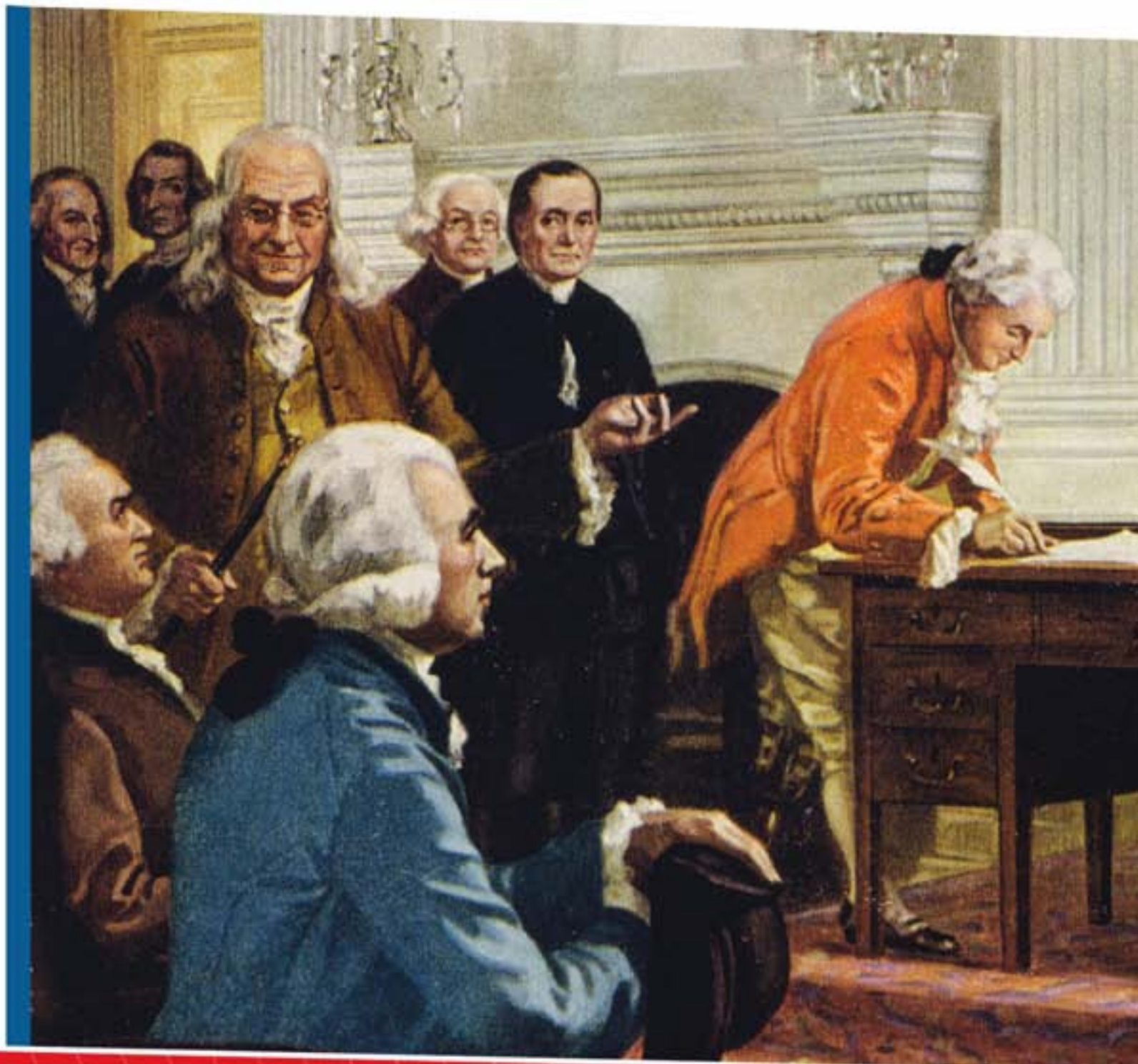
