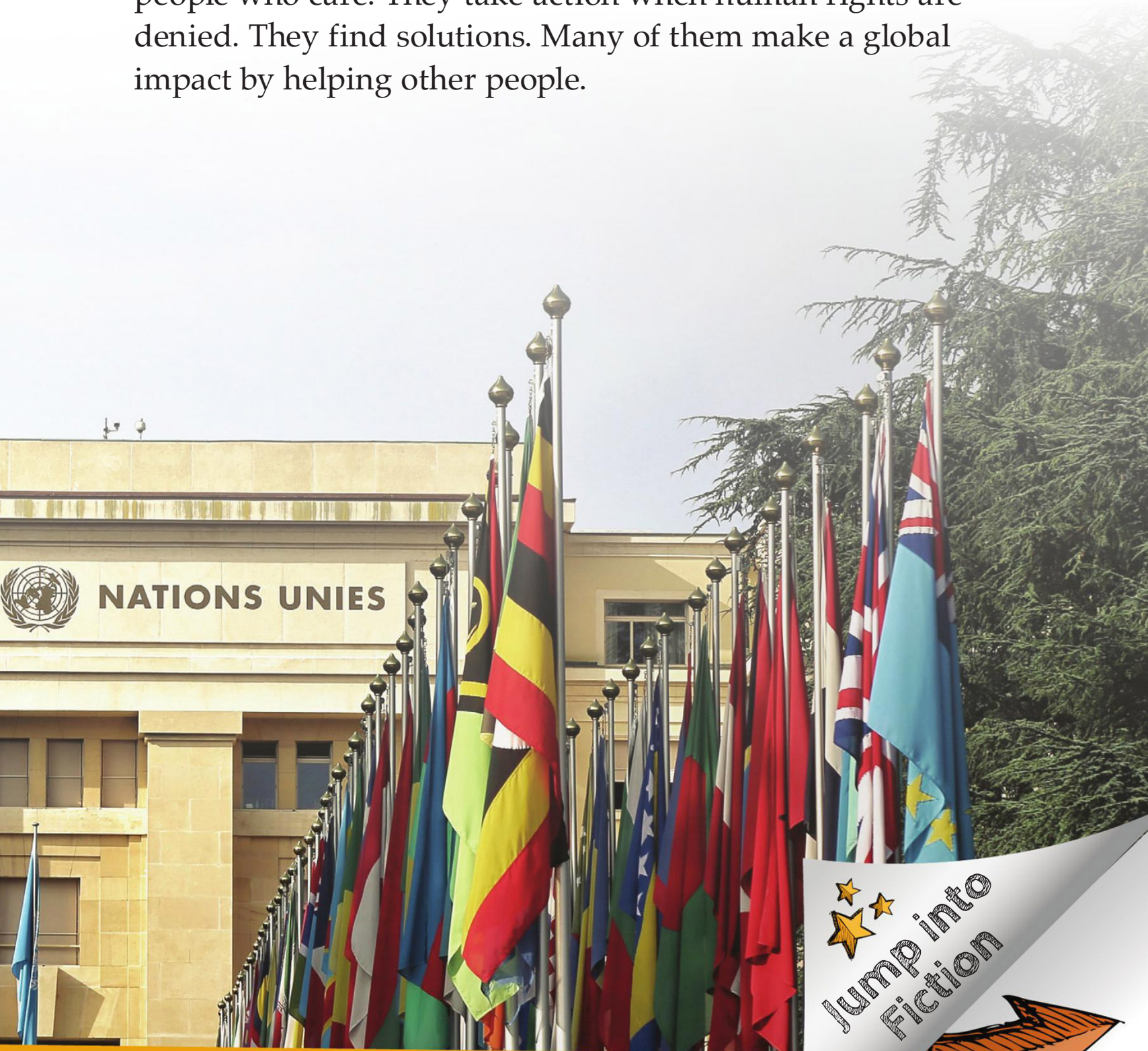


The Human Rights Challenge
