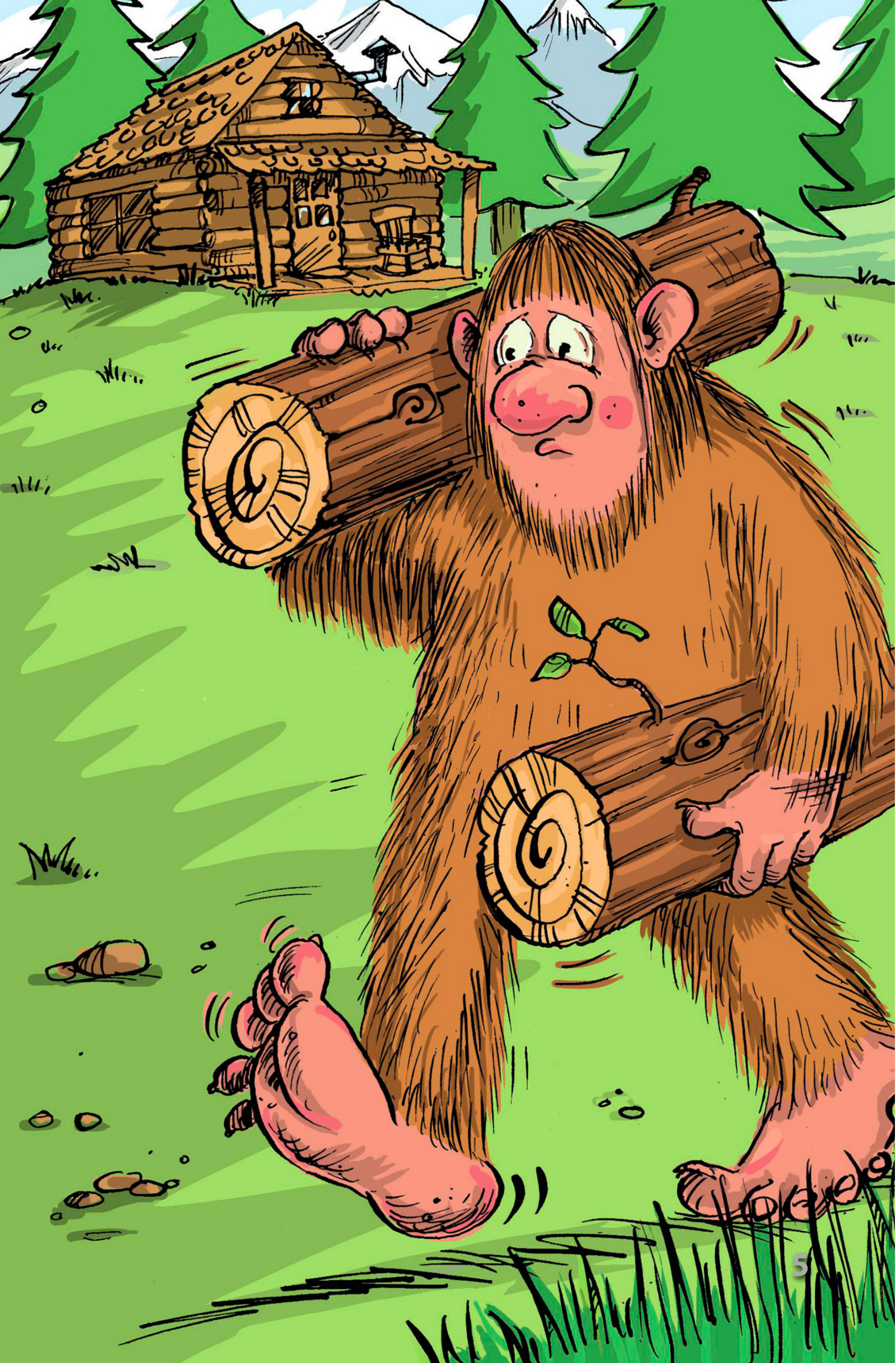


# Frank
