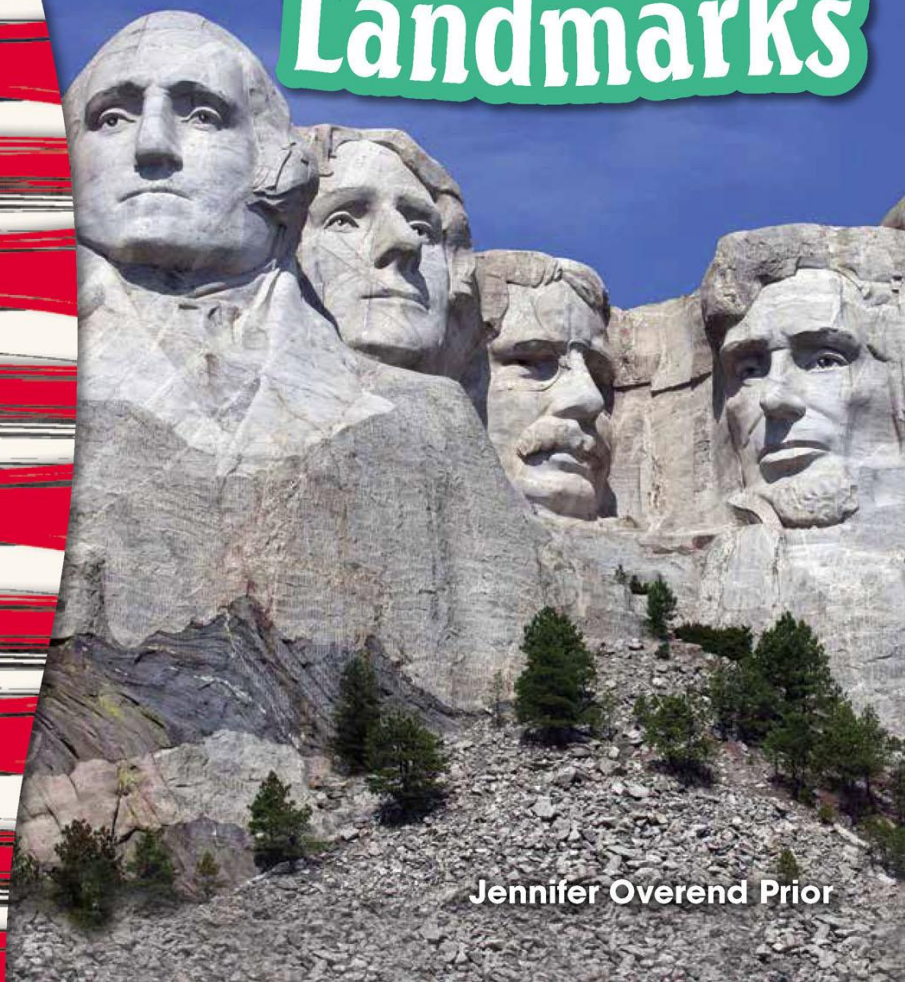



Man-Made Landmarks


