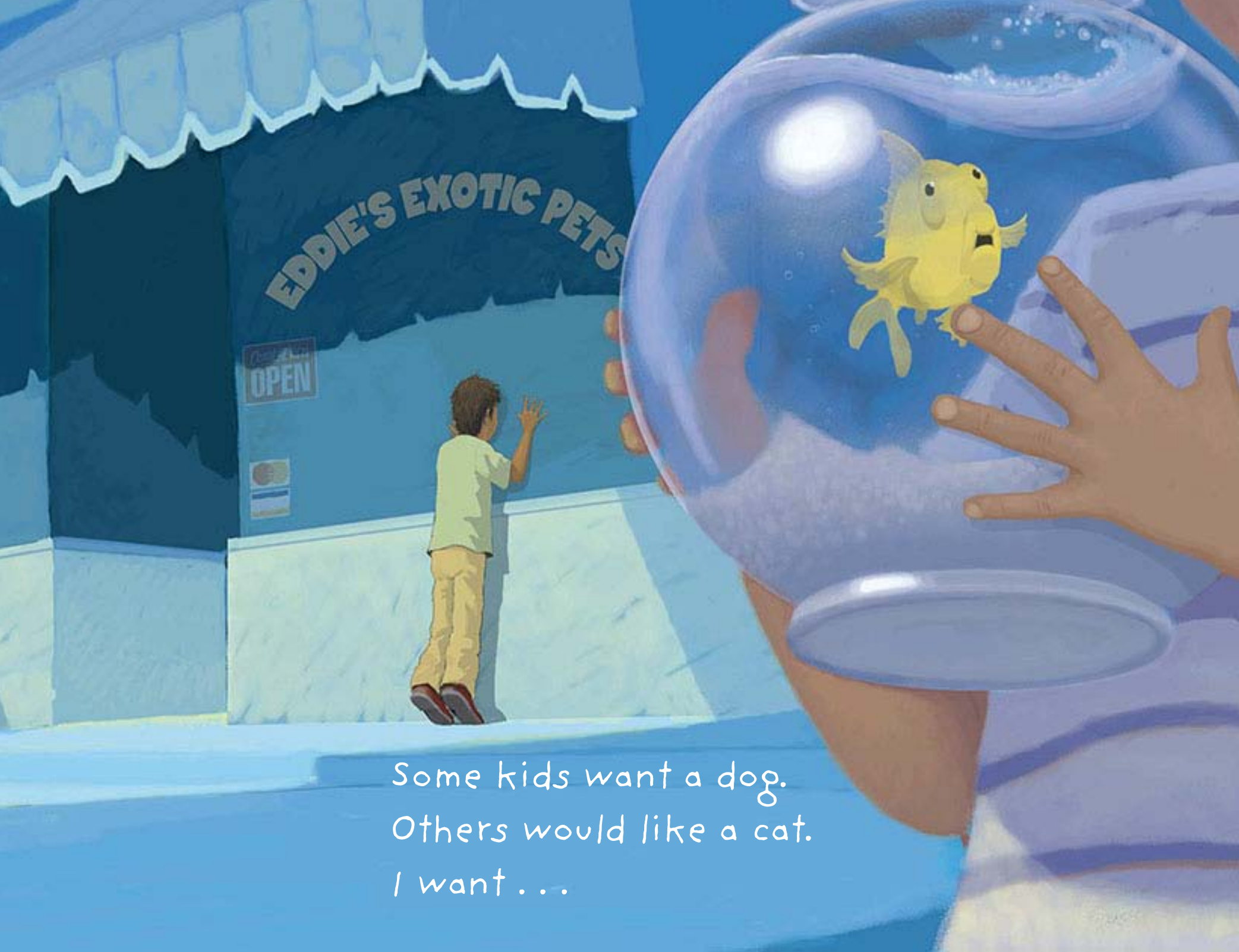

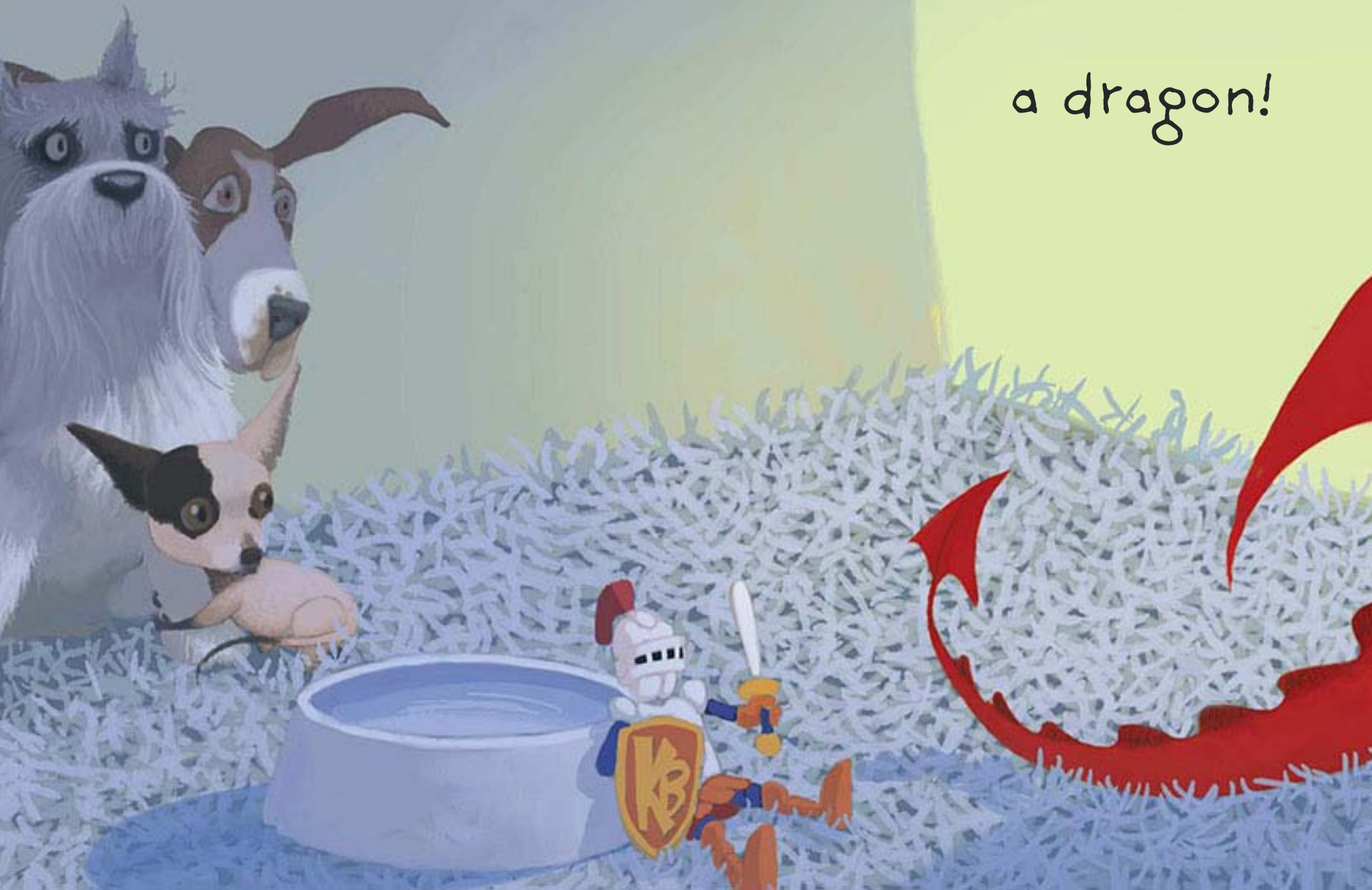

a dragon!







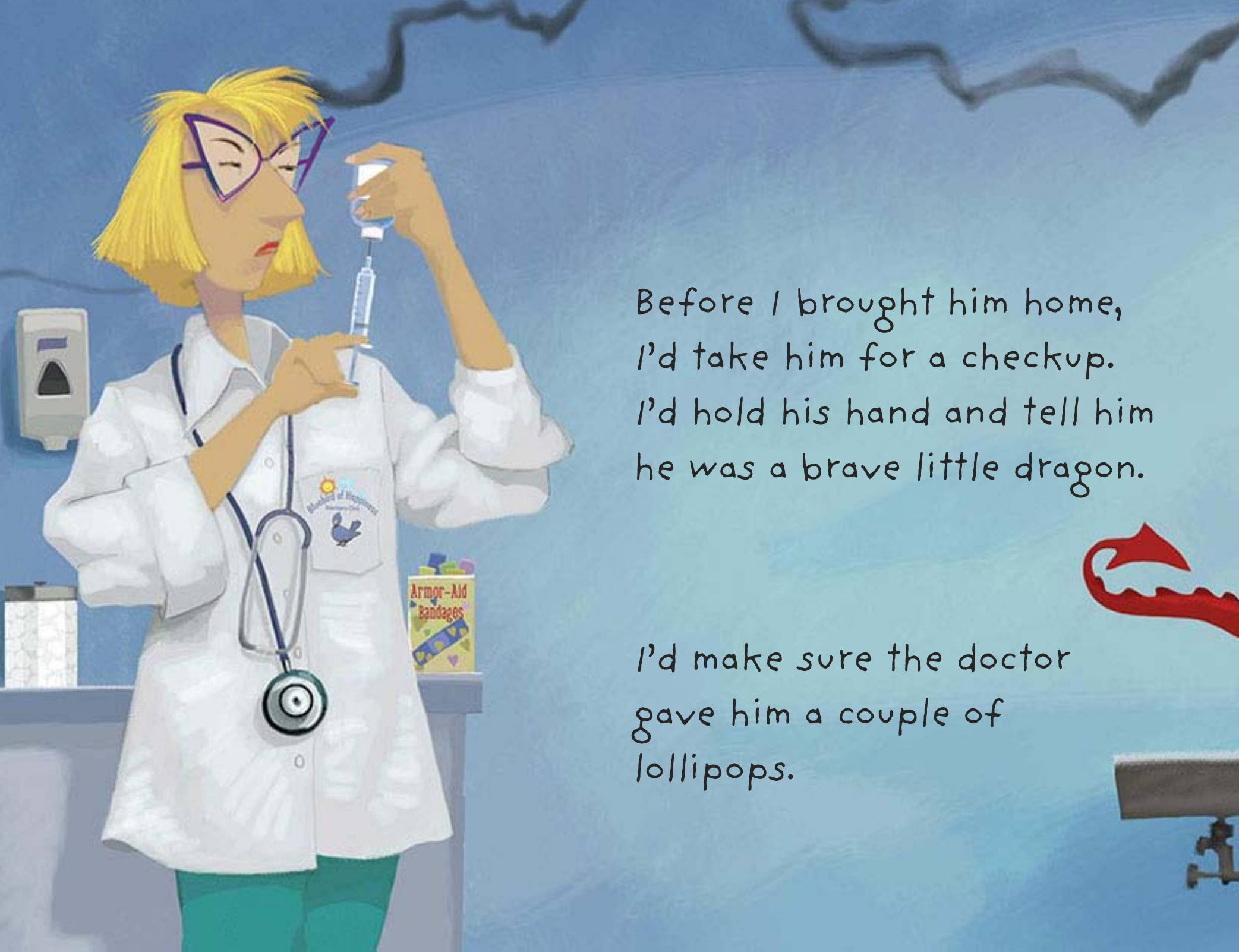
But not a big dragon.
