- Foster visual attention: **this/the read/reading got/get**
- Promote drama, writing or art as follow-up activities.

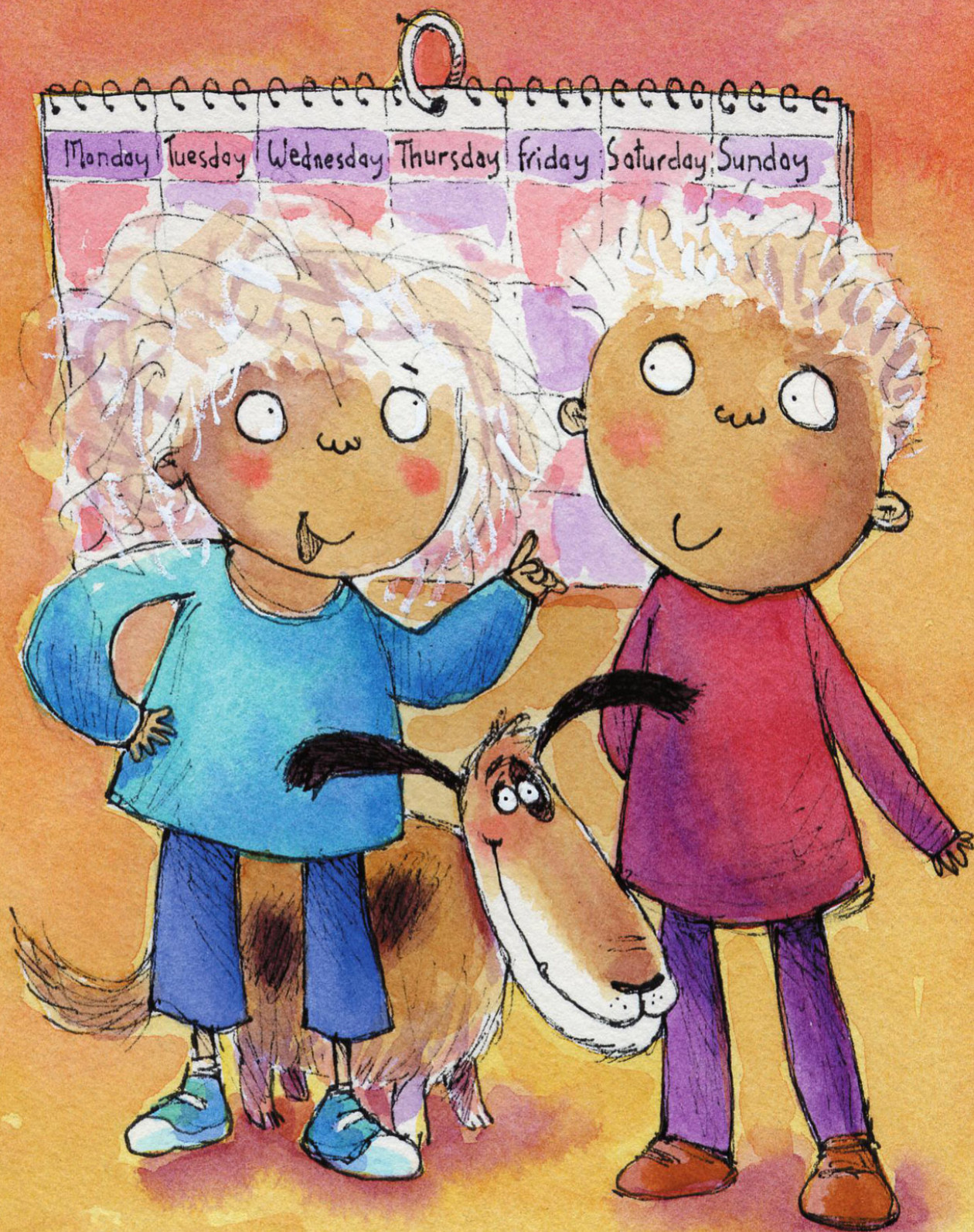
