



"No, you can't. The moment you lie on the bed, you lose your concentration, straightaway! "replied my wife.


"But enjoyment starts straightaway, mom," remarked Maha.




Corporate culture

The salesman replied, "Nothing and oh boy, my boss is really upset."




Communication

The man stammered, "I don't know... my wife told me to!"




Decision-making

"Yes," a student shouted out, "How much for a season pass?"




Communication

"What happened?" asked the friend.


The *lecturer* replied, "My wife found out."


"Well, in that case, I'll create a man for you," replied the Lord.

Adler replied, "A pygmy perched on the shoulders of his master can see much further than his master can!"


